3. Reduce the percentage of **second and third grade** students scoring below and well-below benchmark on the DORF accuracy measure by a minimum of eight percentage points from beginning-of-year 2018 to end-of-year 2019.

1. **LA** from 28% to 32%
2. **Math** from 32% to 36%
3. **Science** from 34% to 38%

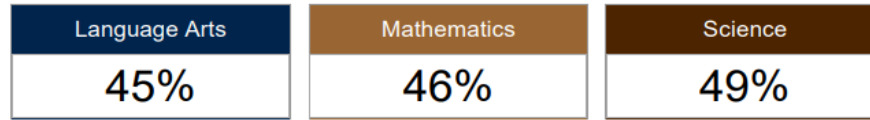

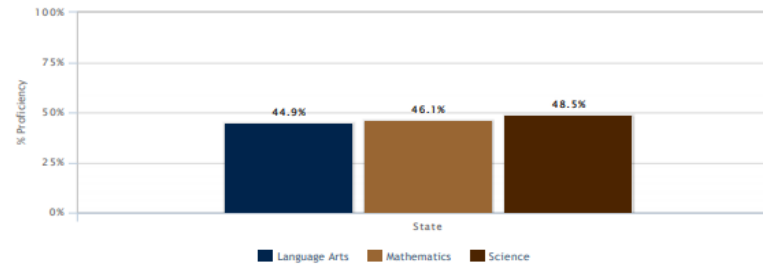

GRADUATION & DROP-OUT RATES

San Juan School District's graduation rate is 87% & drop-out rate is 6%.

The State graduation rate is also 86% and the State drop-out rate is 11%.

Our American Indian dropout rate is 4%, compared to the State rate of 22%.

The District ELL dropout rate is 10% compared to the State rate of 28%.

San Juan's rates of graduation exceed the State averages.

Our rates of drop-outs are substantially lower in every category.
